Mayor Atchley chaired the meeting with Lynn K. McClurg as secretary of the meeting. A motion was made by Vice-Mayor Carr and seconded by Alderman Gibbs to approve the minutes of the July 20, 2009 meeting and to dispense with the reading. Motion carried.

Mayor Atchley opened the public forum section of the meeting. There being no comments, the public forum was closed.

Public Information Officer Bob Stahlke announced that the website improving66.com was purchased by the City and will be maintained by TDOT to update citizens on progress and changes regarding the SR66 construction project. Council expressed appreciation for those that attended the Douglas P. Bishop bridge dedication. Alderman Gibbs expressed concern about and urged employers to become familiar with Employee Free Choice Act legislation.

## OLD BUSINESS

Mayor Atchley presented and placed for passage an Ordinance O2009-020 entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF SEVIERVILLE, TENNESSEE, AS SET FORTH IN THE SEVIERVILLE MUNICIPAL CODE, § 14-201, TO REZONE RECENTLY ANNEXED PROPERTIES NEAR SNYDER ROAD FROM R-1 LOW DENSITY RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT TO C-3 INTERMEDIATE COMMERCIAL DISTRICT." A motion was made by Alderman Ownby and seconded by Alderman Loveday to approve the ordinance as presented and to dispense with the reading. Those voting Yes: Carr, Gibbs, Loveday, McCroskey, Ownby. Those voting No: None. Atchley declared the ordinance passed on second reading.

Mayor Atchley presented and placed for passage an Ordinance O2009-021 entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO CLOSE AND ABANDON A PORTION OF THE RIGHT OF WAY OF INDUSTRIAL PARK DRIVE." Marcus Whaley stated that the property had been acquired by the Sevier County Volunteer Fire Department. A motion was made by Vice-Mayor Carr and seconded by Alderman Ownby to approve the ordinance with a quit-claim deed restricting that the property be used only for a fire department and to dispense with the reading. Those voting Yes: Carr, Gibbs, Loveday, McCroskey, Ownby. Those voting No: None. Atchley declared the ordinance passed on second reading.

## NEW BUSINESS

Mayor Atchley recognized Steve Hendrix, who presented bids for a bowling lane oiling machine and recommended acceptance of the sole bid and award of contract to Bowling Supply Company in the amount of \$23,400.00. A motion was made by Alderman Loveday and seconded by Alderman Gibbs to accept the bid and award the contract as presented. Motion carried.

Mayor Atchley recognized Steve Hendrix, who requested permission to submit an application for a fiscal year 2010 Tennessee Department of Transportation Transit Operating Grant in the amount of \$241,038.00. A motion was made by Alderman Ownby and seconded by Alderman McCroskey to approve the grant application as requested. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Vice-Mayor Carr and seconded by Alderman Loveday to approve the vendors as presented. Motion carried.

Mayor Atchley recognized Steve Flynn, who requested approval to purchase the following "commodity" products at best market price not to exceed budget amounts.

Flynn explained that the water and sewer department spot prices commodity products each time they are ordered. A motion was made by Vice-Mayor Carr and seconded by Alderman McCroskey to approve the purchase of commodity products as requested. Motion carried.

Mayor Atchley recognized Don Myers, who requested approval of a lease agreement with Gateway Village Apartments, a Douglas Cherokee Economic Authority Housing Division, for a satellite police station with a one-year term ending June 30, 2010. A motion was made by Alderman Gibbs and seconded by Alderman Loveday to approve the lease agreement as presented. Motion carried.

Mayor Atchley recognized Don Myers, who requested permission to purchase ammunition from Craig's Firearms in the amount of \$26,676.00 under state contract SWC4037219 ref#1145. A motion made by Vice-Mayor Carr and seconded by Alderman Loveday to approve the purchase as requested. Motion carried.

Mayor Atchley recognized Don Myers, who requested permission to purchase electronic surveillance equipment using Byrne Grant funding from low price vendor Law Enforcement Associates at a total cost of \$8,720.00. A motion made by Alderman Loveday and seconded by Alderman Gibbs to approve the purchase as requested. Motion carried.

Mayor Atchley recognized Don Myers, who requested permission to purchase five in-car digital cameras from sole source vendor L3 Communications Mobile Vision, Inc. at a total cost of \$22,475.00. A motion made by Alderman McCroskey and seconded by Alderman Gibbs to approve the purchase as requested. Motion carried.

Mayor Atchley recognized Don Myers, who requested permission to purchase two in-car computers and modems using Governor's Highway Safety Grant funding under state contract through Insight Public Sector (SWC3005) and Central Communications (SWC420) at a total cost of \$8,377.00. A motion made by Vice-Mayor Carr and seconded by Alderman McCroskey to approve the purchase as requested. Motion carried.

Mayor Atchley recognized Lynn McClurg, who requested approval and/or ratification of the following expense(s) in excess of \$5,000.00:
