-Ups for the month

- Reopening of facilities with guidance from the Tennessee Pledge/Governor's Lee reopening of Tennessee dominated our time and efforts this month. In May we went from being completely closed in Phase I ...then in late May some facilities moved to Phase II reopening levels.
- As of May 31, 2020; basketball courts, playgrounds and soccer fields are the only facilities that remain closed.
- Reopening plans were coordinated with both the Cities of Pigeon Forge and Gatlinburg as much as possible.
- Major progress was made on the John Sevier Memorial Grove...please see picture to at top right as Parks and Recreation Maintenance Staff poured concrete for the sidewalks that will meander through the grove allowing visitors to enjoy as they honor their loved ones.

Aquatics

Due to COVID-19; there were no Aquatic Programs in May. However, Staff stayed busy cleaning and preparing the Family Aquatics Center for opening on June 8th.

Athletics
