

THE BURCHFIEL GROVE AND ARBORETUM

The Burchfiel Grove and Arboretum was established through donations from the Norman Burchfiel Family in the mid 1990's. The arboretum was created in order to add beauty and educational opportunities to the citizens of Sevierville and visitors to the area. The Burchfiel Grove and Arboretum is a community resource providing not only beauty to those who use the trail for walking and jogging, but also to local homeowners and businesses the opportunity to see trees that could be used in their landscapes.

This Tree Walk guide identifies the species of trees along the East and West banks of the West Prong of the Little Pigeon River in downtown Sevierville. At each tree there exists a sign with an identifying number which corresponds with the number listed in this brochure. Other information on the sign includes common name, scientific name, and the estimated mature height and spread of the tree when mature.

The Burchfiel Grove and Arboretum is managed by the professional staff of the City of Sevierville Department of Parks and Recreation with assistance of the citizens appointed to the Trees/Trails and Beautification Committee. 
